Hi Kevin,

You are correct. The construction of the section of dual 300 mm watermain on Erbsville Road is required as part of the Beaver Creek Road and Conservation Drive Project to support the proposed Beaver Creek Meadows residential development.

Construction for the project is proposed to commence with the works along Beaver Creek Road in 2018 at the earliest pending approvals and property acquisition. The construction of dual watermain on Conservation Drive and Erbsville Road likely won't start until 2019 / 2020.

The budget for this project is currently under review as part of the overall DC review at the City. Kevin what is the Region's current budget for this watermain? I would like to touch base with your to coordinate the budget for the dual watermain portion of the works.

Hi Milos,

Regarding the proposed watermain on Erbsville Road, I understand that this watermain in included in the scope of work that the City is undertaking with Stantec for the Beaver Creek / Conservation Drive reconstruction project. The Region has money assigned for our share of the 300mm loop on Erbsville, Conservation, and Beaver Creek Road (it is a dual ownership watermain) in 2017.

With regards to the Erbsville Road watermain that will connect the Zone 5 loop, that section of road is up for a rural resurfacing in 2024. So in order to implement the recommended pressure zone looping associated with the Beaver Creek Meadows Plan, this watermain component would likely need to be conducted as a separate project outside of the Region's Transportation Capital Rural Resurfacing Program in advance of 2024, hence the inclusion in the City's project.

Caroline, please advise if I am misinformed.

The Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF) Guelph District Office appreciates the opportunity to review the City of Waterloo's completed 'Water Distribution Master Plan' (WDMP). It is understood that the WDMP has been completed in accordance with the Municipal Engineering Association (MEA) Master Plan Class Environmental Assessment Process.

The WDMP (e.g. Section 4.4.3) describes that the Region of Waterloo plans to consolidate the Wat 4B, Wat 4C and Wat 5 pressure zones into the existing Wat 5 zone. It is understood that this will require the construction of new transmission watermains to merge the three pressure zones, as shown on Figure 3 (Regional Water System Upgrades) in the WDMP.

Recently the MNRF reviewed and provided recommendations to the City on the completed 'Beaver Creek Road and Conservation Drive Upgrades and Extension of Municipal Services' Environmental Study Report (ESR). The ESR recommends the installation of watermains along Conservation Drive, Beaver Creek Road and Erbsville Road. I was hoping the City could clarify if the new transmission watermains for Wat 5 are to be addressed during the City's detailed design work of the Beaver Creek Road and Conservation Drive servicing, or will this be a separate process?
